The undergraduate Certificate in Health Equity Science (CHES) is administered through the College of Human Sciences (CHS) under the purview of the Department of Human Development and Family Science. The undergraduate CHES aims to cultivate scholarship on health ecology and equity and develop leaders committed to addressing health inequities. This is achieved by helping students acquire a foundation of knowledge on health ecology and equity issues. Students completing this certificate program will have a strong understanding of the role of social context in generating disease risks and disparities in health between groups.
