CONFERENCE

In 2012, I have co-organized a multi-disciplinary forum on sleep and child development, funded in part by the Society for Research in Child Development. The overarching goal of the forum was to promote dialogue, identify pivotal areas in the study of children's sleep, and integrate knowledge of sleep and child development across disciplines towards making conceptual and methodological advances. I have co-edited an SRCD Monograph (2015), which presents the Forum's recommendations for next steps in sleep and child development research.

SCHOLARLY PROGRAM AND ONGOING RESEARCH

My research, which has been supported by the National Institutes of Health (NIH), the National Science Foundation (NSF), and the Alabama Agricultural Experiment Station (AAES), focuses on associations among socio-economic adversity, family risk, and child/adolescent outcomes across multiple domains. Utilizing developmental psychopathology and biopsychosocial approaches, my highly collaborative work has focused on explicating the mechanisms and variables that can exacerbate or attenuate risk and explain differential outcomes in youth exposed to adversity. A main facet of my research program is the examination of children's physiological reactivity and regulation examined through sympathetic and parasympathetic nervous system activity, but includes several physiological systems (hypothalamus-pituitary-adrenal-axis), as pathways and moderators of associations between environmental risk and child/adolescent functioning. Another main focus pertains to sleep/wake processes in children and adolescents with an interest in understanding sleep in the context of physiological regulation, family functioning and the broader socio- cultural milieu (e.g., ethnicity, economic adversity). A recognized feature of my research, facilitated by instrumental collaborations with colleagues from various disciplines, is its multi- and inter-disciplinary nature, and its building of bridges across several disciplines concerned with child health and development.
